To me, canal is like a hub connecting rivers to the sea, like an encyclopedia with tremendous and valuable contents, and like the internet, with powerful connecting and communicating capabilities. I have kept thinking how to take advantage of the Grand Canal in China, and the canals around world as well. Can we utilize the canals to connect the world?
